Statistics in Brief: Seventh Term Senate

The Seventh Term Senate elected on 21st October 2007 has 100 members: 60 were candidates of the Civic Platform Election Committee, 39 of the Law and Justice Election Committee, 1 of his own election committee.

The current Senate has 92 men and 8 women. In the past, the number of women senators ranged from 7 in the first term to 23 in the fifth.

The average age of senators is 51 (in the past, it ranged from 49 in the second term to 56 in the fifth). 14 senators are younger than 40, 1 is older than 70.

91 senators are university graduates (in past terms, the education level ranged from 85 university graduates in the third term to 94 in the sixth). 9 senators have secondary education.

23 senators have graduated in the humanities, 23 in engineering, 11 in law, 11 in medicine, 9 in agriculture, 7 in economics, 6 in physical education, 3 in mathematics, physics or natural sciences and 2 in other subjects.

29 senators hold scientific degrees and titles. There are 12 university professors (15 in the sixth term, 20 in the fifth, 11 in the fourth, 13 in the third, 10 in the second and 26 in the first) and 14 doctors or doctors habilitated.

18 senators had worked as academic teachers (at election time, 4 were active university rectors), 5 were lawyers, 20 managed state or private enterprises. 68 senators have experience in territorial self-government work.

56 senators are seasoned parliamentarians -20 were deputies to the Sejm. 1 served through six Senate terms, 1 served through fifth Senate terms. The number of senators with parliamentary experience in the current term is larger than in the preceding one (34).

76 senators declare affiliation with a political party. 48 senators belong to the Civic Platform Party of Poland, 24 to the Law and Justice, 2 to the "Piast" Polish People's Alliance, 1 to the Movement for Reconstruction of Poland and 1 to the Democratic Left Alliance.

24 senators have no political-party affiliation (in the sixth term -36, in the fifth -22, in the fourth -63, in the third and second -42, and in the first -100). The average number of children per senator is slightly more than two; 32 senators have three children or more.

There were two by-elections conducted during the seventh term Senate:

- the first, on the 22nd of June 2008, when Stanisław Zając was elected, conducted because of the death of senator Andrzej Tadeusz Mazurkiewicz,
- the second, on the 20th of June 2010, when Michał Boszko, Leszek Piechota and Alicja Zając were elected. Election conducted because of the tragic death of senators Krystyna Bochenek, Janina Fetlińska and Stanisław Zając who died in the plane crash in Smoleńsk on the 10th of April 2010.
